## School Kits are needed by MCC to distribute to children all over the world. The following is the current list for 2019: All NEW items only:

4 spiral notebooks (8.5 in x 10.5 in and 70 sheets

8 new unsharpened pencils

1 ruler (flat, good quality; must indicate centimeters; inch markings optional)

12 colored pencils (in packaging)

1 large eraser

2 new black or blue ballpoint pens
